

> JOHN 17:1-5,21-26

¹Jesus spoke these things, looked up to heaven, and said, "Father, the hour has come. Glorify your Son so that the Son may glorify you, ² since you gave him authority over all people, so that he may give eternal life to everyone you have given him. 3 This is eternal life: that they may know you, the only true God, and the one you have sent —Jesus Christ. 4 I have glorified you on the earth by completing the work you gave me to do. 5 Now, Father, glorify me in your presence with that glory I had with you before the world existed.

²¹May they all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us, so that the world

may believe you sent me. 22 I have given them the glory you have given me, so that they may be one as we are one. 23 I am in them and you are in me, so that they may be made completely one, that the world may know you have sent me and have loved them as you have loved me

²⁴ "Father, I want those you have given me to be with me where I am, so that they will see my glory, which you have given me because you loved me before the world's foundation. 25 Righteous Father, the world has not known you. However, I have known you, and they have known that you sent me. ²⁶ I made your name known to them and will continue to make it known, so that the love you have loved me with may be in them and I may be in them."

I have begun to wonder if we own our smartphones, or if they own us. We depend on them for so many things, such as apps for purchases, maps to help us find our way, and endless games to play. Oh, I nearly forgot that we make the occasional phone call. One of the most popular uses of smartphones is to access social media platforms. On average, some 3.2 billion users spend two hours and twenty-two minutes per person on social media every day.¹

It can be difficult to resist the urge to check social media. Research shows that when people give in to that compulsion, their anxiety level rises. Being constantly connected to social networks or answering endless texts makes it difficult for us to log off and focus on the things going on around us in our real lives. People feel obligated to keep checking in—just in case.²

Social media may build bridges between the world and us, but it also puts up walls. Too often we are consumed with our social media profiles, and we miss the most important relationships we have. We miss the joy of spending uninterrupted face-to-face time with friends and family, and we waste the opportunity to really know God.
