

#### > JOHN 15:1-8

- 1"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener.
- <sup>2</sup> Every branch in me that does not produce fruit he removes, and he prunes every branch that produces fruit so that it will produce more fruit. 3 You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you.
- <sup>4</sup> Remain in me, and I in you. Just as a branch is unable to produce fruit by itself unless it remains on the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. <sup>5</sup> I am the vine; you are the branches. The one who remains in me and I in him produces much fruit, because you can do nothing without me. <sup>6</sup> If anyone does not remain in me, he is thrown aside like a branch and he withers. They gather them, throw them into the fire, and they are

burned. <sup>7</sup> If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you want and it will be done for you. <sup>8</sup> My Father is glorified by this: that you produce much fruit and prove to be my disciples.

Many in the church see two categories of people—ministers, and everybody else. The ministers are those who sit around the church building all week and do a whole lot of nothing, except pray and study the Bible. (Not true! Your pastors work about as hard as anybody on the planet.) They're the ones who teach the Bible studies, visit people in the hospital, and officiate weddings and funerals. Of course, ministers are also responsible for preaching every Sunday. After all, public speaking is terrifying to over three-quarters of the population.<sup>1</sup>

While we may be tempted to believe that ministers' responsibilities are vastly different from the rest of the church, the truth is that there's a lot more in common than many may think. Visiting the sick isn't just the responsibility of our pastors—many of us have the gift of mercy and should use that gifting to comfort the suffering. Of course, pastors are responsible for teaching the Bible, but there are a lot of people who are gifted to teach. And when it comes to sharing our faith, proclaiming the gospel to the world, that's something we're all called to do.

You may never be formally ordained for a ministry position, but every follower of Christ is called to minister to others. We do not need to fear the work. God has called us to this purpose, and we are not alone.


