I trust that you had a very wonderful Thanksgiving, and that you are now having another wonderful week! God has been so very good to all of us. We have much to be thankful for.

Thanksgiving and Christmas are my favorite holidays (holy days) of the year. On Thanksgiving Day, we are reminded in Scripture that in our prayers, we are to let our requests, by prayer and supplication, be made known unto God WITH THANKSGIVING.

One dear saint said, "I won't be unhappy. It is all I have to give to God, and I will praise and thank and glorify Him by a happy face and a radiant life." What a great and Godly attitude! May this attitude of gratitude be with each of us of this holiday season.

You can't serve from your sofa. You can't have community of faith on your sofa. You can't experience the power of a room full of believers worshipping together on your sofa.




