FROM YOUR PASTOR

I enjoyed being with the church family Sunday in worship. It was a great and enjoyable day of worship, praise and fellowship, morning and evening. If you were not in attendance, you were missed, and I hope you will be back on track in church attendance this Sunday. Invite someone to come to church with you!

We welcome Shane, Stephanie, and Savannah Rodgers in our church fellowship as they united with our church Sunday morning. Shane, Stephanie and Savannah, welcome to our community and family!!

This Sunday evening, 3 April, at 5 P. M., Mr. Boris Goldin of the Chosen People Ministries will present "Messiah in the Passover" at FBC. Mr. Goldin will set a table with items traditionally used at the Passover meal and detail their spiritual significance. He will explain the connection between the events of the first Passover in Egypt and the redemption that Jesus accomplished, as well as the deep bond between the ancient Passover feast and the Christian communion celebration today. He will also answer questions after His presentation.

Mr. Goldin was born in Russia and is now leading the Chosen People Ministries work in Ukraine, so it will be an interesting evening. You don't want to miss this special presentation.

Sunday, April 10 is Palm Sunday, and the next Sunday, April 17 is Easter Sunday. These are always great opportunities to be in church and to remember Gethsemane, the Cross, the Empty Tomb and our Risen Lord. And again, great opportunities to invite others to church because people are very open to attending church on these special days on the church calendar.

Good Friday service is April 15 at 6 p. m. The Sanctuary Choir will present "When Darkness Comes", and we will observe the Lord's Supper in this service.

In 1895, the first missions offering to benefit the work of home missions in the Southern Baptist Convention was promoted by the Woman's Missionary Union (WMU). The Home Mission Board (now known as the North American Mission Board) asked for \$5,000 toward its work. The WMU exceeded that goal.

Today, more than \$1 billion has been raised since the beginning of the Annie Armstrong offering for North American mission efforts. 100% of the offering (named after mission's advocate/WMU leader, Annie Armstrong, in 1934) goes to missionaries and their work of sharing the life-transforming gospel of Jesus Christ throughout the United States, Canada and their territories.

A tireless servant of God and a contagious advocate and supporter of mission's efforts throughout the world, Annie Armstrong rallied churches to give more, pray more and do more for reaching people for Christ.

Her work led women to unite in missions' endeavors that ultimately led to the formation of the Woman's Missionary Union, for which she served as the first corresponding secretary.

The Annie Armstrong offering goal this year is \$70 million. The goal of First Baptist Church is \$4,000. FBC gave \$4,193.00 to the Annie Armstrong Offering last year.

It is important that you know that your church gave a total of \$112,358.91 in 2021 to all phases of the Southern Baptist Convention Cooperative Program, including the Arkansas Baptist State Convention, the Arkansas Baptist Children's Family Ministry, Baptist Collegiate Ministries at UAPB and SEARK, and to the Dixie Jackson, Lottie Moon and Annie Armstrong Missions offerings.

In addition, we also financially supported Hope of the Delta, Salvation Army, Wycliffe Translators (Wes and Kim Clement), Neighbor to Neighbor and Pine Bluff Mission. Our total mission-related giving to all causes this past year was approximately 20% of our total budget offerings.

You can give to Annie Armstrong Easter Offering throughout the year through your church. God is using First Baptist Church in a mighty way through missions and evangelistic outreach, including our giving and television ministry outreach!!

Also, First Baptist Church this week sent \$4,000 to Samaritan's Purse and \$4,000 to the International Missions Board of the Southern Baptist Convention for humanitarian relief in Ukraine. Pray for the church in both Ukraine and in Russia. Thank you for your faithful support of missions and the Great Commission!

It is a great time to go back to church! God bless you and yours, and I look forward to seeing you back in church this Sunday! Invite someone to come with you. Pastor




