FROM YOUR PASTOR

Chuck Colson, founder of Prison Fellowship and Christian leader following his conversion to Christ in 1973, wrote in his book about the church, entitled, "The Body", four goals of the church. He listed these four:

1. To exalt God in worship.

2. To edify, taking new Christians and maturing them in the faith.

3. To evangelize, bringing people to a saving knowledge of Christ, with a church attitude that is outward oriented rather than a holy huddle mentality.

4. To extend, reaching out into the community to meet physical, spiritual, relational, and emotional needs.

And these goals are so very true and very much faithful to the teachings of the New Testament. We are to exalt God in worship, edify (build up, teach, encourage), the believers, evangelize the lost, and extend into the community with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

My question to each of us today is, "Are we being faithful members of the body?" Being a faithful, growing, holy, worshipping, evangelizing church member is clearly taught by Jesus and in the New Testament.

If you are a member of First Baptist Church, I call upon you to examine your faithfulness to the Lord and to His Church in the light of the teachings of the Word of God.

Is it okay for a Christian to not attend church? Is the local church irrelevant today?

Let me be clear. Church membership and faithful attendance is essential to one's walk in Christ. The Bible says much about this matter, more than I can go into here, but here are a few verses that deal with this matter of church membership and attendance.

The writer of Hebrews clearly says that we are not to forsake the assembling of ourselves as is the manner of some in Hebrews10:25, "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching. ." In the previous verse (V. 24) the writer says, "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds."

Now it would be hard to "spur one another on toward love and good deeds" if we are sitting at home and watching a TV or internet evangelist. Hebrews 13:7 is an impossible command for the Christian not assembling with the saints to follow since it says to "Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith." You cannot imitate what you do not see and you cannot remember or follow or imitate the example of church leaders if you never attend.

Paul writes in Ephesians 4:11-12, "So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up." It is hard to build up the body of Christ if we are alone at home. If you read the entire New Testament, there is not one single lone-ranger Christian. You will always see the apostles mentioning the church in general. The epistles never, ever address single, solitary Christians about their walk in faith.

Some say they love God but can't be around other Christians, but we are told to assemble together and love one another (John 13:34-35). Members of the church are God's children, so you are in essence saying, "God, I love You, but I can't stand to be around your children." As a father myself, I'd not be very happy with your telling me, "We love you, but can't stand to be around your family."

Jesus said that He will build His church (Matt. 16:18) and the gates of hell will not prevail against it. The Bible says Jesus loved and died for His church. If you believe that church membership, attendance and involvement is optional then you do not understand scripture.

As your pastor, I urge you, if you are not faithfully being a part of the Lord's church, and you are bornagain Christian (unless Providentially hindered), the Lord may chasten you and correct you since He chastens every one of His children who are disobedient to Him (Heb. 12:6).

If you are a Christian, let this serve as a biblical reminder; you should not be forsaking the assembling of yourselves. God desires His people to serve Him through a church. He commands it. I encourage you to not take this matter lightly. Our spiritual obedience and the spiritual heritage of our families and our Christian testimony in the community are at stake. Jesus loves His Church. So should we. See you Sunday. Pastor.
