

Financial FYI

Each Monday, the Counting Committee meets to count the receipts from Sunday. They remove checks and cash from the offering envelopes verifying the amount given with the amount on the envelope. They also indicate the check number or show if it was a cash contribution. If a check comes in without an envelope, they will make one. They count the coins, currency, and checks and note on a worksheet the amount given for each gift (budget, television, Fulfill the Vision, mission offering, memorials, etc.). The receipts are deposited in the bank.

The empty envelopes and the worksheet go to the Financial Secretary who posts the gifts to each person's record of contribution statement. The posted amounts plus any general receipts are balanced with the amount of the deposit and with the designated area the gift is given for.

If you have special instructions, please write them on the front of the envelope or place them on a piece of paper inside the envelope. Finally, memorial information is given to the general secretary and the pastor's secretary who write thank you notes and send letters to the families of those who had loved ones recognized with memorials. The only time additional deposits are made is at the end of the year, as we accept last minute gifts.
