8-Page Mini Books

Supplies: 5½-by-8½-inch sheets of paper (2 per child), scissors, stapler, drawing and writing supplies


- Fold two pieces of paper with the short sides together. Staple the papers on the fold.
- Invite kindergartners to write words of a Bible verse or words related to the Bible story on the pages.
 Lead them to illustrate as desired.
- Option: Use colored construction paper cut to size as covers for the books.



Envelope Books

Supplies: Long envelopes (1 per child), construction paper, scissors, writing supplies


- Cut the construction paper into strips to fit inside the envelope. Print Bible verses onto sheets of paper.
- Encourage the kids to copy the Bible verses or words related to the Bible story onto individual strips of paper.
- Lead the kids to decorate the outside of their envelopes and place their strips inside.



Accordion Books

Supplies: 4-by-18-inch strips of paper, scissors, writing materials, Bible verses for kids to copy

- Fold each strip in half; fold each end back toward the middle fold.
- Direct the kids to print a Bible verse, draw pictures, or make up their own stories for their books.



Paper Bag Books

Supplies: Lunch-size paper bags (2–3 per child), stapler with staples, decorative paper, glue sticks, plain paper cut to fit inside the bag pages, writing supplies

- Cut the closed end from each bag.
- Fold two or three bags in half so that the open ends are on the right. Staple the bags on the fold. .
- Lead kids to glue decorative paper on the cover and write words or draw pictures on the pages. Invite kids to draw on paper to insert inside the openings.

Shaped Books

Supplies: Construction and white paper cut into large shapes (hearts, stars, circles, etc.), art supplies, stapler or brads

- Allow each child to choose two colored shapes for covers and several white pages for inside.
- Encourage kids to write or draw things related to the Bible story or write the Bible verse.
- Help kids staple their books together along one edge. Or use a brad to attach the pages.
