Grace and peace to you!

The holiday season is upon us once again! I am excited to spend another Christmas season with my church family. I love the lights, the decorations, the cold weather, the warm fellowship, and the emphasis on the greatest gift that God has ever given to the world- His Son.

But before Christmas, we still have Thanksgiving to celebrate. As I write this, we are one week away from Thanksgiving Day. And so, I thought this would be a good opportunity to reemphasize thanksgiving in our prayer life. The following is an excerpt from the sermon I preached last month on Thanksgiving in Prayer, as a part of our ACTS (Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, Supplication) Prayer series.

"1 Thessalonians 5:18- In everything give thanks, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

Paul says to give thanks in everything. This is just like the command to rejoice always and to pray without ceasing. Once again, the idea is all-encompassing. There isn't a circumstance you can find yourself in where thanksgiving is inappropriate. There isn't a thing you can go through that drowns out all the reasons to be thankful. We are to give thanks in everything- not some things, not sometimes. In everything.

Paul says that this is God's will for us in Christ Jesus. A question that many believers have in their lives is, "How do I know what God's will for me is?" Well, when it comes to decisions, the solution is to pray to the Lord for wisdom and to apply it as He provides it. But there are many things we are told explicitly is the will of God for everyone. And here, Paul says one of those things that is the will of God for every believer is that they give thanks in everything.

The key to all of this is the phrase "in Christ Jesus." Our union to Christ through faith is the grounds for our rejoicing, our praying, and our thanksgiving. Because Christ died for us and rose again, granting us forgiveness of sins and eternal life, and because we have received those things by the grace of God through faith in Christ, and have thus been united to Christ, we can now rejoice always, we can pray to God without hindrance, and we have reason to be thankful no matter what. Think about it- things could go as bad as possible here on earth. You could lose everything. You could lose your health, your wealth, your family, your friends, but because you still have Jesus, you have a reason for thanksgiving. You are in Christ, which means if you have nothing in this life, you still have everything in eternity."

We have so much to be thankful for, and one day a year is not really sufficient for offering thanksgiving to the Lord. I hope that you, as Paul writes, have made a practice of giving thanks in everything. After all, this is God's will for you.


